## SIXTEENTH JUDICIAL CIRCUIT

SUPPLEMENTAL ADMINISTRATIVE ORDER – CRIMINAL DIVISION

Effective November 30, 2020

WHEREAS, the Coronavirus pandemic is ongoing and confirmed cases are increasing in number, and in order to protect the health and safety of the general public, circuit court judges and circuit court employees, and pursuant to Illinois Supreme Court Rule 21(b) and the Court's inherent authority; and

WHEREAS, the Supreme Court of Illinois entered Order M.R. 30370 on May 20, 2020, authorizing each Circuit Court to return to hearing court matters, whether in person or remotely, according to the schedule to be adopted for each county by the Chief Judge of each Circuit. The Order recommends that Circuit Courts shall continue, to the extent possible, to allow for appropriate social distancing; and

WHEREAS, it is in the best interests of all of the above-named parties and individuals to limit the number of people in the Kane County Judicial Center and in each of the individual courtrooms to as few as needed to accomplish critical tasks; and

**WHEREAS**, the Presiding Judge of the Criminal Division and the Chief Judge of the 16<sup>th</sup> Judicial Circuit have determined that additional temporary restrictions are necessary at this time; and

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that the following temporary procedures will apply to all cases assigned to the Criminal Division:

- 1. All jury trials (felony, misdemeanor, traffic) are suspended effective November 30, 2020, and will not recommence until February 1, 2021. All served subpoenas will be continued to the next trial date at the request of the parties.
- 2. All in person appearances by attorneys and litigants are suspended effective November 30, 2020 and will not recommence until February 1, 2021. Attorneys and litigants who are scheduled for in person dates in December of 2020 and January of 2021 are expected to appear remotely during that time period.
- 3. Effective November 30, 2020, all documents that are not submitted to the Court through the ECO system must be submitted via DocuSign.
- 4. Bench trials and contested evidentiary motions currently scheduled in December of 2020 and January of 2021, at the discretion of the Presiding Judge, may take place in person as currently set.

- 5. Judges will be available to hear emergency matters as required. Emergency matters must be approved for scheduling by the Presiding Judge after consultation with the trial judge. Attorneys must contact the assigned judge by email, which must set forth the emergency in detail. The assigned judge will respond after consulting with the Presiding Judge.
- 6. Effective February 1, 2021, the in person/remote staggered court calls will resume.
- 7. To the extent that they do not conflict with this Supplemental Order, the terms of the Administrative Order effective June 8, 2020, remain in full force and effect.
