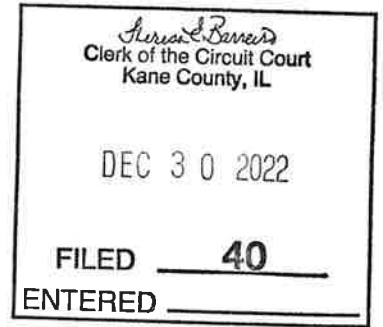

GENERAL ORDER 22-22
Effective January 1, 2023



IN THE MATTER OF PROCEDURES)

TO DENY PRETRIAL RELEASE)

WHEREAS, consistent with 725 ILCS 5/109-1(a-5), effective January 1, 2023, requiring any person arrested and brought before a judge to determine pretrial release under 725 ILCS 5/110-1 et seq. to have the court appoint a public defender or licensed attorney at law of this State for the purposes of the hearing;

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED that when a person not represented by counsel is brought before a judge to determine pretrial release conditions or where the Kane County State's Attorney's Office has filed a Petition to Deny Pretrial Release, the Kane County Public Defender or its designee shall be deemed appointed by the court as defense counsel at any such hearing.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that at the conclusion of a pretrial release hearing where conditions may be imposed or a hearing on the Kane County State's Attorney's Office Petition to Deny Pretrial Release, the judge shall determine, based on the arrestee's financial condition, whether the appointment of the Kane County Public Defender shall end or continue as a full appointment in all future proceedings.
