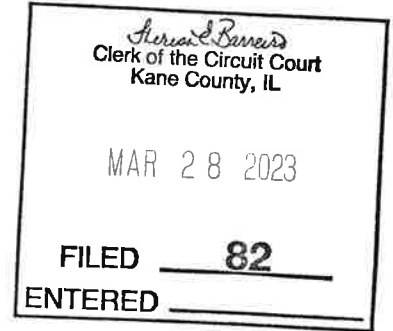

WHEREAS, in review of the outstanding warrants in the Sixteenth Judicial Circuit, it was determined that many of the cases are post sentence cases that never had final closure;


WHEREAS, the Kane County Circuit Clerk's Office has the ability to generate a listing of post sentence cases, with or without Petitions to Revoke filed, that have outstanding warrants, may owe outstanding fines, costs and fees, and need entry of a Final Closing Disposition;

WHEREAS, this listing may also contain outstanding companion cases.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

1. That Kane County Circuit Clerk's Office is to send notice to each of the defendants on the generated list of outstanding warrant cases to the defendant's last known address. Notice is to indicate that the Defendant is to appear via Zoom, and the court date should be a minimum of 21 days out from the date that the notice is sent.
2. That the Kane County Circuit Clerk's Office is to schedule a minimum of 50 cases twice per week before the Presiding Judge in Courtroom 203 at the Kane County Judicial Center.
3. That the Kane County Public Defender's Office and Kane County Court Services be notified of any closures on the listed cases for their records.
4. This order is to remain in effect from this date until the generated list of cases has been notified and heard before the court.
